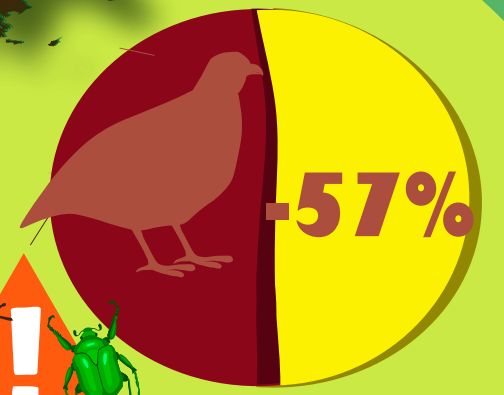


WHY WE NEED SPACE FOR NATURE ON FARMS

WE ARE IN A BIODIVERSITY CRISIS

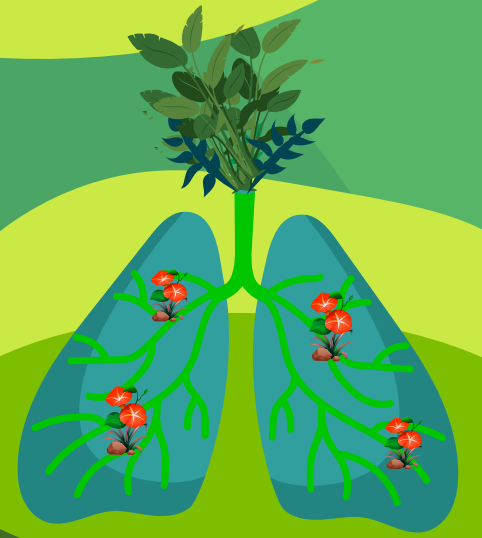
TO SURVIVE, NATURE NEEDS SPACE:

SPACE FOR NATURE HELPS FIGHT THE CLIMATE CRISIS:

natural vegetation captures and stores co₂.



On farms, this means hedgerows, flower strips, field margins, ponds or fallow land.

THE SCIENCE IS CLEAR: TO RESCUE WILDLIFE, FARMS NEED AT LEAST 10% OF SPACE FOR NATURE.



Natural vegetation on farms is good for crops: it boosts pollination and natural insect predators
